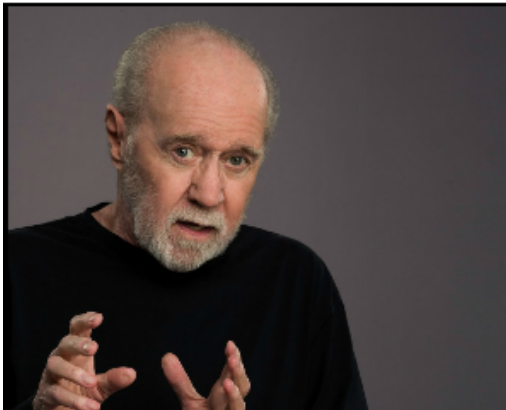
"Vanity of vanities," says the Preacher; "Vanity of vanities, all is vanity." 1:2



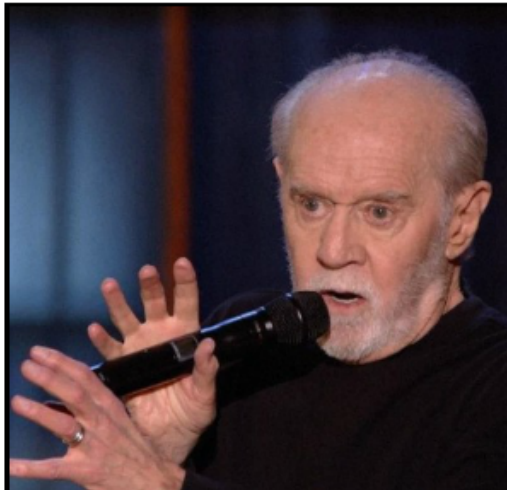
I applied my heart to know wisdom, and to know madness and folly. I perceived that this also was a chasing after wind. 1:17



I said of laughter, "It is foolishness;" and of mirth, "What does it accomplish?" I searched in my heart how to cheer my flesh with wine 2:2,3



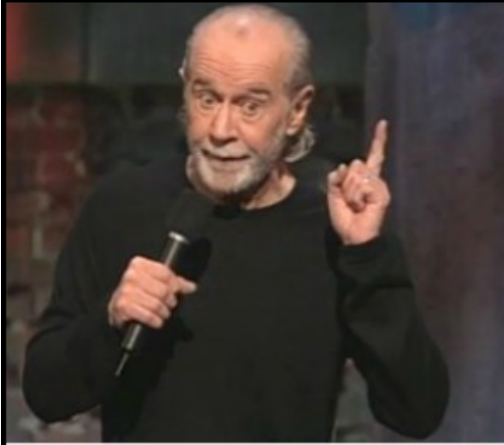

For all his days are sorrows, and his travail is grief; yes, even in the night his heart takes no rest. This also is vanity. 2:23



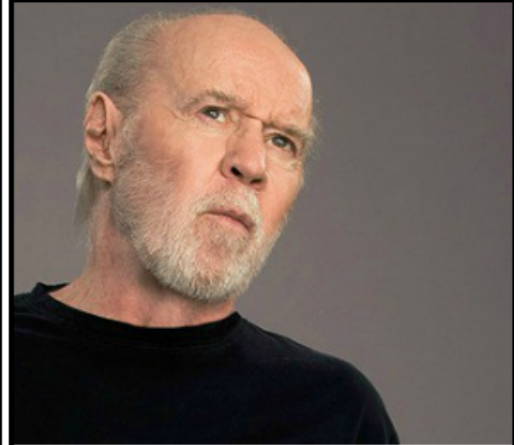
There is nothing better for a man than that he should eat and drink, and make his soul enjoy good in his labor. 2:24



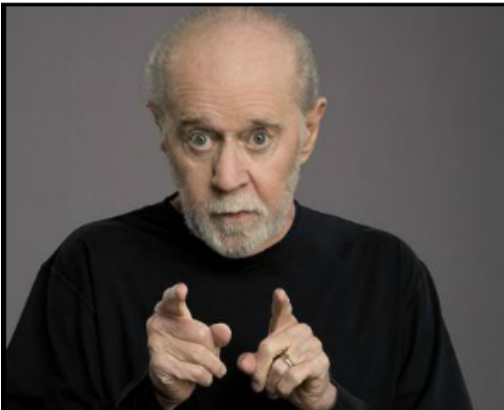

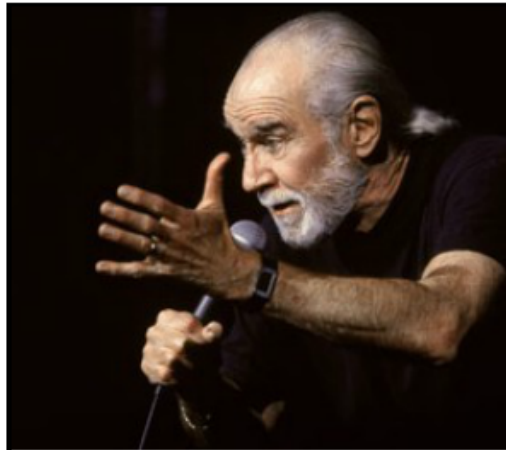
He has also set eternity in their hearts, yet so that man can't find out the work that God has done from the beginning even to the end. 3:11

There is an evil which I have seen under the sun, and it is heavy on men...weakness, This is vanity, and it is an evil disease. 6:1-2



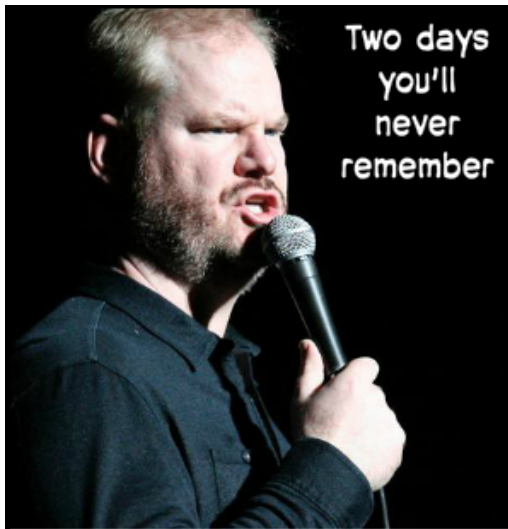
I can see you

It will be a bit soggy though



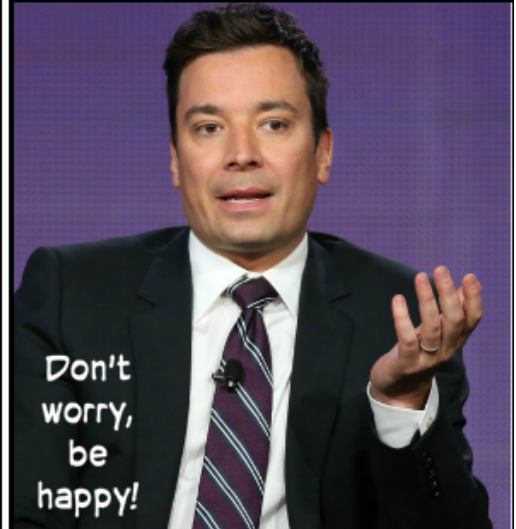
Cast your bread on the waters; for you shall find it after many days. 11:1
